What is Quota?



Quota is an 88-year-old international service organization that links members of all ages, occupations, and nationalities in a worldwide network of service and friendship.

The first Quota club was formed in 1919 in Buffalo, N.Y., by Wanda Frey Joiner, a businesswoman who wanted to create an organization for other women to network and serve the community.

With a motto of "we share," Quotarians are known especially for their service to deaf, hard-of-hearing, and speech-impaired individuals and disadvantaged women and children. Quota members share the values of serving and encouraging others, developing friendships, and promoting international understanding.

Quota International of Indiana, Pa., Inc. is 53 years old and 50 members strong. It was incorporated in 2008. Membership is open to any person interested in community service.

Quota of Indiana meets monthly at 5:30 p.m. at the Indiana Elks. Guests are welcome at any time. Dues for the club year are just \$100, and members pay only for the dinners they attend. Quotarians have the opportunity to be part of a number of service and fellowship committees, ranging from youth mentoring to deaf awareness to the charity committee.

Quotarians maintain a busy schedule of activities and service projects throughout the year... and have fun doing it all!

During the 2007-2008 club year, Quota of Indiana raised more than \$15,000 for community charities through a reception upstairs@theconey and the annual St. Patty's Day Indoor Golf Tournament.

These funds are used to support Quota's ongoing mentoring program with community youth, the Alice Paul House, Downtown Indiana, scholarships for speech and hearing students at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, and placement of sound amplification systems in Indiana County school districts, along with other projects to raise awareness about speech and hearing issues, like the "Save Your Buds" campaign for children and a program to distribute earplugs to publicize hearing safety.

Quota of Indiana also maintains wheelchairs at the Indiana Mall and actively participates in community projects like the Festival of Lights, Salvation Army Kettle Campaign, and the Treasures for Children program.

Our Quota Network...

There are 7,000 active Quotarians in 300 clubs in 14 different countries throughout the world. Locally, Quota of Indiana is part of District 3, which includes several western Pennsylvania clubs, including Quota of Blairsville.
